PRESENTATION OF MATTERS BY RESIDENTS AND TAXPAYERS:

Ms. Pat Hurd of 1803 Fairview Ave. expressed that she would like to see Council do a survey of residents to examine the need of assistance for, but not limited to Band, Drama and School Sports. She suggested Council should begin to apply for grants.

Ms. Sandy Berkane of 1912 Ferry St. and Ms. Christy McNally of 4097 Lawn St. advised of an incident that happened on October 13, 2024, at the Wilson Fall Fest which resulted in four members and several volunteers of the Celebrate Wilson Committee stepping down. At the last meeting the resigning members made two motions prior to their resignation: first they voted to purchase additional lights for the park for the holiday season and second to donate the Committee's fundraising apparel leftovers, old and new to the Lincs Center. The vote was unanimously approved for the additional lights but the decision to donate the apparel has become controversial. Ms. Berkane and Ms. McNally respectfully asked Council to honor the final vote to donate the Committee apparel to the LINCS.

Mr. Bracken advised as far as the apparel the inventory still belong to the committee and should stay with the committee to aid in future fundraising opportunities.

Linda Hewitt of 2325 2nd St. advised Council her neighbor has a junk vehicle in her driveway that is filled with trash as well as trash piled up along side the vehicle. Ms. Jones advised that the Code Officer is aware of the issue and is in the process of sending a notice of violation.
